NH State Commission On Aging Releases Annual Report

Concord, NH: (November 2, 2022) The New Hampshire State Commission on Aging (NHCOA) is pleased to announce the release of its annual report.

“We’re excited to share this report with the Governor and members of our State Legislature,” said Rebecca Sky, Executive Director of the Commission. “It provides recommendations for policy changes that have the potential to improve the quality of life here in the Granite State. It provides an overview of our efforts over the past year, studying the issues that as we age, matter the most, as well as a view into what we will focus on in 2023.”

Formed in 2019 through a legislative process, the Commission is comprised of members of the public appointed by the Governor, state employees and elected officials from across NH who advise the Governor and General Court on policy and planning related to aging. The Commission seeks to advance forward thinking public policy and initiatives that ensure we can all thrive and be valued as we age.

“A major factor in the Commission’s progress is the hard work and commitment to the cause of aging by the Commission Members,” said Sky. “In addition the Commission is grateful to the many people who shared their expertise and time informing this report.”
